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# History



Old Kilmun House was built by the Duke of Argyll in 1696, with stonework on the house dating back to an earlier 16th or 17th Century house. The property was owned and lived in during the late 19th Century by sugar magnate, collector, philanthropist and founder of Benmore Gardens, James Duncan, and then by the Younger family. James Duncan planted 6 million trees at Benmore, but many of the finest were those he planted in the garden at Kilmun. The whole garden is yours to explore, see if you can find the tree swing or the table and chairs carved from a tree that had lived a few feet away for over 50 years.

It was the Younger family who added the separately owned Victorian extension to the west side of the house. Our lovely neighbor Matthew lives in the extension, if you bump into him, feel free to ask him about any of the rare trees or birds in our garden.

# **Food and Drink**







#### The Shore Café

5 mins drive or a 30 min walk Great for a quick lunch, paninis, wraps, rolls, cakes & coffee. Also sells some basic groceries. Allows dogs outside only.

#### The Strone Inn

5 mins drive or a 30 min walk Allows dogs in bar area.

#### Blairmore Café

10 mins drive

Varied menu of soups, salads, wraps. Good for vegan/vegetarian. Allows dogs.

#### The Coylett Inn

10 mins drive

Set on the shores of Loch Eck with stunning views, this pub/restaurant offers great food and friendly service. Allows dogs in bar area.

#### Groceries

Morrison's in Dunoon delivers to Old Kilmun House, but you will need to book a delivery slot at least a week in advance. They also offer a click and collect service.

The closest convenience store is The Cot House Service station which is about 5 minutes' drive from the house in the direction of Dunoon. It has a good selection of basic groceries and wines and is open every day until 10pm.

In Dunoon itself, there is a large Morrisons and a Co-op which are both open 7 days a week.

Loch Fyne deli is on the shore of Loch Fyne and offers delicious smoked salmon, cheese, cold meats, crackers, chutneys etc We highly recommend arranging a wine tasting and getting some cheese and nibbles in from Loch Fyne to accompany the wine.

# Things to Do

#### Walks


There are incredible walks you can get to directly from the house or within a short drive.

#### The Kilmun Arboretum

The arboretum is the road directly to the right of the house when you leave the driveway. Walk up the road and you will be able to access 3 trails through the forest. There are more than 150 tree species from around the world!

#### Benmore Botanic Gardens

This 120-acre mountainside garden is not to be missed and is only a 5 minute drive from the house! With a world-famous collection of plants and trees and spectacular views of Holy Loch and the neighbouring mountains from the high viewpoint, we feel so lucky to have this on our doorstep!




## Bishops Glen

This is a lovely, easy and flat circuit of the Bishops Glen Reservoir. It goes through pine forest and also has gorgeous views of the reservoir. It takes about 30 mins in total so it's a great walk to do with kids.

## Longer Walks...

The Ardnadam Heritage Trail, Glen Finnairt, Glen Massan, Glen Brantar, Ardentinny Forest, and Cowal Way are a short drive away. You can do circular routes that take anything from an hour and a half to eight or nine hours.

There are maps and guides in the sitting room, and more details are available from the tourist office in Dunoon.



#### Pucks Glen

This is our favourite walk and is truly magical! There are stream and waterfalls and it looks like an enchanted forest! From the Arboretum there are multiple ways to walk to Pucks Glen. It takes about an hour and fifteen minutes walk to walk there from the house and the same on the way back. We always use Google Maps to find our way! Alternatively you can drive to the 'Pucks Glen' car park in your Google Maps. It's only a 5 minute drive and then the circular walk through the Glen and then through the pine forest and back to the car is about 45 minutes.



# Lochs, Kyles, Jails & Castles

Explore Loch Fyne, Loch Lomond, the Kyles of Bute and the Mull of Kintyre peninsula for absolutely breath-taking scenery.

## Inveraray

55 minutes away

Make sure you visit Inveraray Castle, the tall bell tower, the jail and the ruins of Rob Roy's house. Dogs are not allowed in the castle but you can do some lovely walks in the woodlands and along the river which are part of the castle estate.

## The Kyles of Bute

48 minutes away

A short and quite pretty drive takes you across to the Kyles of Bute with spectacular views down to the Island of Bute itself and beyond. Tighnabruich and Kames are pretty villages you can stop at on the way

## Loch Lomand 1 hour away

Stunning loch with amazing walks and boat trips. Go for afternoon tea or lunch at the Cameron House Hotel.



# Beaches

Ostel Bay/Kilbride just beyond Tighnabruich, is a gorgeous golden sandy beach. This secret little treasure is a little hard to find, park up at Kilbride farm and walk (15mins) along the little lane next to the farm...and *shhhh*, don't tell anyone!

## The Isle of Bute 1 hour away

From Colintraive you can take the ferry across to Robbodoch on the Island of Bute. A drive around the Kyles, plus a visit to Bute itself adds up to a full day out. Bute is an undiscovered jewel in Scotland's crown of islands. Rothesay is a pretty town with a Castle and Museum, loads of cafes and bars and restaurants, outdoor entertainments for kids and a putting green. There are quite a few gardens open to the public on the island, which is only 25kms long and can be cycled around in a day



# **Activities Nearby**



## The Spa at Portavadie

45 mins away

The spa includes a 16 metre indoor pool, a toddlers pool, outdoor spa pools, an outdoor infinity pool and a sauna. It's well worth a visit but you'll need to pre-book your swimming and spa session. There's also a great bar and restaurant.

# **Location and Directions**



Please note if using SatNav, the postcode above will not take you directly to the house.

## From the South (Ferry from Mcinroys Point to Dunoon)

If coming from the South, there are two ferry ports in Gourock, the Mcinroys Point Ferry is the one you want (about 5 mins drive West of the Gourock Ferry Port) as this is the Car Ferry. You can buy tickets on the ferry, but it is much cheaper if you buy them from either of the co-ops in Gourock or Paul's Food and Wine shop (94 Shore St, Gourock PA19 1RB).

The ferry is every 20 mins (on the hour, 20 past and 20 to the hour) and takes about 20 mins.

Turn right when you leave the ferry port in Dunoon and follow the road to Kilmun as shown above. Old Kilmun House is the driveway on the left immediately after the road and sign leading to "Kilmun Arboretum" and before the bins. It is just before St Munns Parish Church. Please note SAT NAV does not take you to the exact location.

#### From the North

If you are coming from the North via the A815, turn left instead of right at the top arrow on the map above and follow the steps above.

From Glasgow International Airport.

## By Train

Take a taxi to Paisley Gilmore Street Train Station (5 mins) & then get the Westbound Train to Gourock (30mins). From Gourock train station, walk to the Gourock Ferry Terminal (5 mins) & get the ferry to Dunoon (30mins). You can then get a taxi from Dunoon to the house (15 mins) or get another member of your party to come and pick you up.

## By Taxi

You can get a taxi from Glasgow airport to the house, however this may be relatively expensive due to the ferry trip back and forth for the taxi driver. If you choose this option then be sure to prebook the taxi to get the best price.



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
